

ETERNAL LIFE

On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

Luke 10:25

A certain ruler asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Luke 18:18

A friend of mine was telling me about his day, and included was a funeral. The person was the wife of a boyhood friend, and he reminisced what that couple had done with their lives. It sounded like they were very active and had achieved some notoriety. But now those days were over in old age. Where did the time go-years that seemed to swiftly fly by?

Does it feel you don't have enough time, too many things to accomplish and not enough time to do it all? Maybe you look at little kids growing up way too fast—our daughter-in-law was teasing her son that she was not going to let him have his 4th birthday-she was going to keep him at 3 forever because she didn't want him to grow up. He insisted that he would be 4! Time marches on. Does it have to? Do we have to settle for "4 score and 10" as a ripe old age? (that's 90 years old, which many would think is a long life.)

Jesus was asked about eternity. It is surprising how many times eternal life is addressed in scripture. God speaks of the Tree of Life in Genesis. Job and the psalmists declare their hope in receiving it. People questioned Jesus about obtaining immortality by what they do in this mortal life. And Jesus answered their questions with the only solution. Nicodemus heard it when he came to Jesus at night. It is the revelation embodied in the only One who came from the place where there is no death, who created life and sustains life and can give eternal life. It will come by the means that involved His death on a cruel cross. "Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

John 3:14-16(NIV)

He spoke to the woman at the well, "...whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

John 4:14

He spoke to the religious rulers who questioned Jesus' authority, "Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life." John 5:24.

And he pointed out to them the solution they were keen on finding was right in the Word God had given them. "You study the Scriptures diligently because you think that in them you have eternal life. These are the very Scriptures that testify about me." John 5:39

But what kind of life would it be if we still had to grapple and suffer with sin's afflictions, an eternity forever striving with pain, hate, jealousy, immorality, treachery, brutality, and conflict? These are the price we pay for sin. In fact, we will suffer the end result of sin as the scripture states, "For the wages of sin is death," Romans 6:23a, yet with the promise, "but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 6:23b.

Even when death comes, that does not mean the promise is not true, "For my Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day." John 6:40

His eternal plan is to invite us into a perfect, sin-free relationship with Him through His gift of redemption and adoption. God planned it before time began, and we can have confidence that He will accomplish it when we invite Jesus into our lives as our savior and lord. By the gift of the Holy Spirit, we begin to live a new life in Christ today, corrected by him, encouraged by him, and enabled by him as new creations, "Those whom I love I rebuke and discipline. So be earnest and repent. Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me. To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne, just as I was victorious and sat down with my Father on his throne." Revelation 3:19-21 (NIV)

Let's look forward with hope! "Keep yourselves in God's love as you wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to bring you to eternal life." Jude 1:21


