

Education: Still looking for a children's activity book. Will be setting a date for the Confirmation service. Have four confirmands: Ella, Bailey, Cade and Brock.

Trustees : By Russ. Hoping to get the parking lot done this Fall. Lights on the cross will be replaced.

Old Business:

Carpet Cleaning: Pastor has made arrangements for the cleaning to be done by the first week in Sept. Part of the cost will be in exchange for work Pastor did.

New Business:

Endowment Audit: Linda K. has arranged for an audit of the Endowment books.

Music Groups: Carol Snelling from Park Rapids will be here August 18th and Taunya Todd will be here on Sept. 15th. Pot luck lunch both Sundays.

Pulpit Supply : Pastor will be gone Sept 29th for LCMC Annual Gathering. The Ottesons will do the service that day. Will be paid \$150 plus mileage.

Music for the Meatball Dinner: Russ will check with the Fladlands. Possibly have music for 2 hrs of the 3 ½ hrs we serve starting at 5 pm..

Lund Lutheran.*


*Sunday, August, 25th we had Carol Snelling share


